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LEISURE AND SPORT COMPLEX IN BERN

During the 20th century, the open-air baths of Weyermannshaus were gradually enveloped by urban growth, in particular following the successive construction of major rail and motorway transportation hubs. Despite the unattractive context, the site is a much used and appreciated green oasis with nature heritage status. The compact building form frees up space for the century-old park. The program of accommodation includes an indoor hockey rink adjacent to an outdoor rink and an indoor swimming pool comprising three individual pools. Each facility has its own changing rooms and equipment. The building aims to achieve Minergie P-ECO standards.
