



## EXTENSION OF THE OLYMPIC MUSEUM IN LAUSANNE

The Olympic Museum was inaugurated in 1993 in a magnificent estate overlooking the Lake Geneva landscapes.

Thirty years later, the museum was reorganized in keeping with the architecture in place: the permanent exhibition areas were extended from 2,000 to 3,000 m<sup>2</sup>, the interior pathway and museography reorganized, the reception and restaurant areas of the panoramic roof terrace enlarged and protected by a fine net of fibre-reinforced concrete slats. The construction was carried out as part of a total professional services contract with a cost guarantee.
